**Convoyer's Report:** Firstly can I say that we were a bit caught out with the number of birds entered resulting in late pick- ups. I'm told there were about 1300 more birds than last year. Many thanks to the guys from Midsomer Norton who had stayed behind and assisted in crate moving – in particular Lionel Vining of Carlingcott who went to Farrington to collect birds as there was no room on the one transporter. We drove to the Lyndhurst site arriving at 1.30am when we put water before all the birds before turning in for some sleep at around 2.15am Rose at 5.30am and topped up water. The sun had not yet risen. It rose soon after 6am and it was a clear morning – a bit cold to start with an ENE breeze. Visibility was excellent. Consulted with the race advisor regarding en route weather and possibility of clashing and, as a result of it warming up and with a clear blue sky I planned on releasing the birds at 8am. However with the sheer amount of crates on board it took longer than expected to cut the strings. We eventually liberated at 8.30am and, except for a very few stragglers, the convoy cleared the site immediately. This was remarked on by another convoyer on site.
